



Privacy Policy

1. Overview

Dreadnought Resources Limited (“Dreadnought” or “the Company”) values and respects the privacy of the people we deal with. Dreadnought is committed to protecting your privacy and has therefore adopted this policy in accordance with the National Privacy Principles (“NPPs”) as set out in the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth).

This Privacy Policy (Policy) describes how we collect, hold, use and disclose personal information of individuals who interact with Dreadnought, including our employees, representatives from our contractors, landowners, pastoral lease holders, industry association representatives, users of the Company website and shareholders. The Policy also describes how we maintain the quality and security of your personal information.

2. Information We Collect

Dreadnought, our agents and service providers may collect or receive some or all of the following information about you.

Log Data

The Company website uses cookies. A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers the website puts on your device if you allow it. These cookies recognise when your device has visited our website before, so we can distinguish you from other users of the website in order to improve your user experience.

We do not use cookies to identify you, just to improve your experience on our website. If you do not wish to use the cookies, you can amend the settings on your internet browser so it will not automatically download cookies. However, if you remove or block cookies on your computer, please be aware that your browsing experience and our website’s functionality may be affected.

Personal Information

Personal information is information or an opinion about you as an individual that identifies you or from which your identity can be ascertained, or any other information protected as ‘personal information’ under applicable law.



3. Legitimate Reasons for Processing Your Personal Information

We only collect your personal information when we have a legitimate reason for doing so. In which instance, we only collect personal information that is reasonably necessary to provide our services to you. We may also process sensitive personal information where you have provided your consent or it is necessary to comply with legal obligations.

4. Collection and Use of Information

We may collect personal information from you directly or when you do any of the following on our website:

- Sign up to receive updates from us via email or social media channels
- Use a mobile device or web browser to access our content
- Contact us via email, social media, or on any similar technologies
- When you mention us on social media

We may use your information in order to comply with the law.

Dreadnought will not use or disclose any information about you without your consent.

5. Security of Your Personal Information

Dreadnought will endeavour to take all reasonable steps to keep any stored information secure, accurate and current. Your information is stored on secure servers that are protected in controlled facilities. In addition, our employees and the contractors who provide services related to our information systems are obliged to respect the confidentiality of any personal information held by Dreadnought.

Although we will do our best to protect your personal information, we advise that no method of electronic transmission or storage is 100% secure, and absolute data security cannot be guaranteed. We will comply with laws applicable to us in respect of any data breach.

6. Retention

Dreadnought will only retain your personal information for as long as we need to. This time period may depend on the purpose for which your personal information was collected, in accordance with this policy and relevant legal and regulatory requirements.



7. Your Rights over Your Personal Information

You always retain the right to withhold personal information from us, with the understanding that your experience of our website may be affected. We will not discriminate against you for exercising any of your rights over your personal information. If you do provide us with personal information, you understand that we will collect, hold, use and disclose it in accordance with this privacy policy. You retain the right to request details of any personal information we hold about you.

If we receive personal information about you from a third party, we will protect it as set out in this privacy policy. If you are a third party providing personal information about somebody else, you represent and warrant that you have such person's consent to provide the personal information to us.

If you have previously agreed to us using your personal information for direct marketing purposes, you may withdraw your consent at any time. We will provide you with the ability to unsubscribe from our email-database or opt out of communications. Please be aware that we may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity.

If you believe that any information we hold about you is inaccurate, out of date, incomplete, irrelevant, or misleading, please contact us using the details provided in this policy. We will take reasonable steps to correct any information found to be inaccurate, incomplete, misleading, or out of date.

If you believe that we have breached a relevant data protection law and wish to make a complaint, please contact us using the details below and provide us with full details of the alleged breach. We will promptly investigate your complaint and respond to you, in writing, setting out the outcome of our investigation and the steps we will take to deal with your complaint. You also have the right to contact a regulatory body or data protection authority in relation to your complaint.
